

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

In our second half term we will be focusing on self-regulation. Self-regulation is such an important part of our children's everyday lives. For this we will be learning how to listen closely to our friends needs and wants and responding appropriately, taking turns and choosing different ways to communicate feelings such as frustration, impatience and sadness. We will also be introducing characters for zones of regulation that will supports us to self regulate behaviour in the classroom.

Communication and Language:

We will continue to develop our speaking and listening skills by using simple sentences when we speak and learning to take turns in conversation. We will also learn new vocabulary related to our topics and story books. Lots of learning of repeated refrains will take place reading our texts this month. Encouraging super sentences both at home and at school is a big focus for us!

Physical Development:

This half term is super exciting for us as we are having a go at learning lots of different types of games. These include listening and attention games, tag games and even singing games! Not only do they help us with our communication skills and gross motor skills, but they are SO much fun! FSI teachers will be sharing their own favourite school games with their classes ,

Mathematics:

Our focus this half term will be all about size and measuring Introducing important vocabulary such as 'big' 'medium' 'small' 'long' and 'short' will enable us to use mathematic language in our everyday learning and differentiate objects by size and length.

Understanding the World:

We will be exploring changing states. For this we will be looking at different ways materials can change dependent on what has been added to them or taken away and commenting on these changes. I wonder what will happen when we try to make porridge for Baby Bear?

Expressive Arts and Design:

To end our 'Once Upon A Time' topic, we will be performing our very own version of one of our core texts. We are so excited to share it with our GFS FSI community!
