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Prerequisites

- Students must attain a minimum of 5 International GCSE/GCSEs at grades 4 - 9 (A* - C) including English and Mathematics
- Students should attain A* - B (7 or above new GCSE) in the subjects intended to study at International AS/A level
- Students applying from a curriculum other than the National Curriculum for England will be assessed against relevant criteria/standards

Important information

- Parents will receive a Google link/form to register for courses **once reenrolment or enrolment has been completed**. The deadline for completing the Google form is Monday, 10th April 2023 (*only applies to current GFS students*)
- Students must choose a minimum of three A Level/BTEC courses. Students are not permitted to study more than two BTEC courses as part of their options. Students that choose three A Level/BTEC courses must choose a Super Curriculum offering from Option Blocks 1-4. Students who are studying four A Level/BTEC courses must choose a Super Curriculum offering from Option Block 5 only. Please note that Super Curriculum options are enrichment opportunities, not A level subjects
- Arab and non-Arab Muslim students must take Islamic Education as a compulsory subject. Ministry of Education Arabic as a first language is compulsory for students who are registered in the school/KHDA under an Arab passport
- The international A level and BTEC options chosen are **conditional**, based upon awarded International GCSE/IGCSE results (or results from other curricular)
